Dr. Hiroko Bissen-Miyajima is Director and Professor of Ophthalmology at Tokyo Dental College, Suidobashi Hospital, Tokyo, Japan. She specializes in cataract and refractive surgery and her reputation as a skilled surgeon is well known around the globe. She has won many prominent video and paper awards in the area of cataract and refractive surgery. Dr. Bissen-Miyajima is a regular reviewer for several medical journals, and served as President of the International Intraocular Implant Club (IIIC).

Dr. Geoff Whitehouse completed ophthalmic training at Sydney Eye Hospital in 1993. He holds fellowships at Royal Alexandra for Children 1993 (Sydney University) and University of Calgary, Canada 2003. He has published numerous papers in peer reviewed literature on cataract surgery (especially lens comparisons) and glaucoma and has been an invited speaker at NSW and Australian meetings. He works in private practice on the mid north coast in NSW with a special interest in surgical equipment design (Rumex toric pre op marker, head piece for Stryker operating tables, etc) and cataract surgery. He is previously a medical advisor for Objectivision.

Dr. Julian Sack graduated in 1984 from the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa. He then finished a number of senior registrar posts in Ophthalmology, Neurology and Emergency Medicine. He obtained his Fellowship in Ophthalmology in 1991 and then emigrated to Australia to complete a Fellowship position at the Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital in 1993. He commenced Private Practice 1995 where he has a Cataract and Refractive Practice. He is currently a Consultant at the Royal Victoria Eye and Ear Hospital where he is involved in the training of Registrars. He has also given numerous lectures to GPs, Optometrists and Pharmacists. He is currently one of the few surgeons in Australia performing Implantable Contact Lenses (ICL) surgery.
